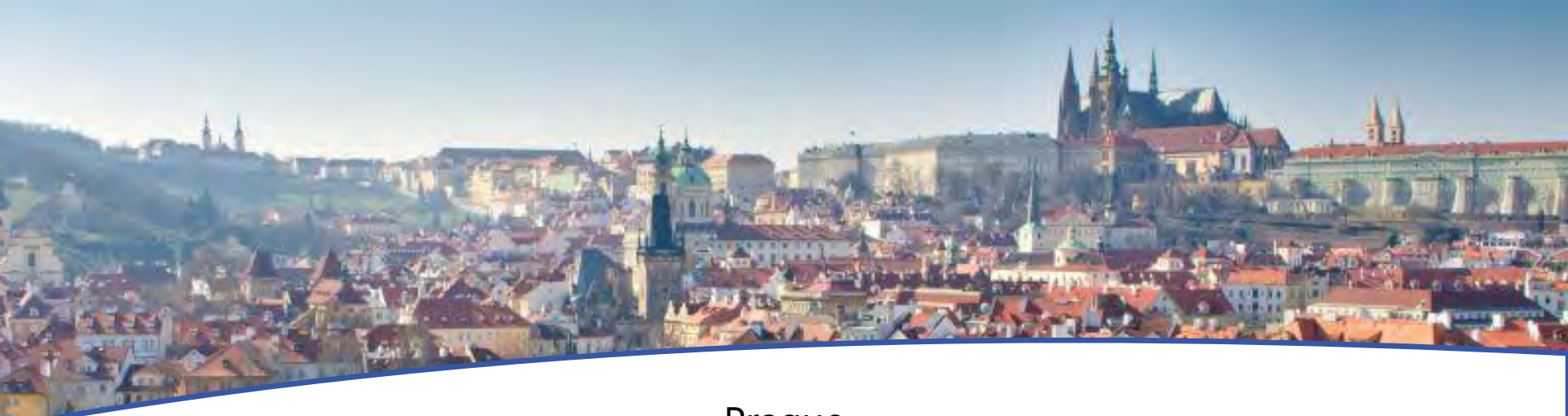

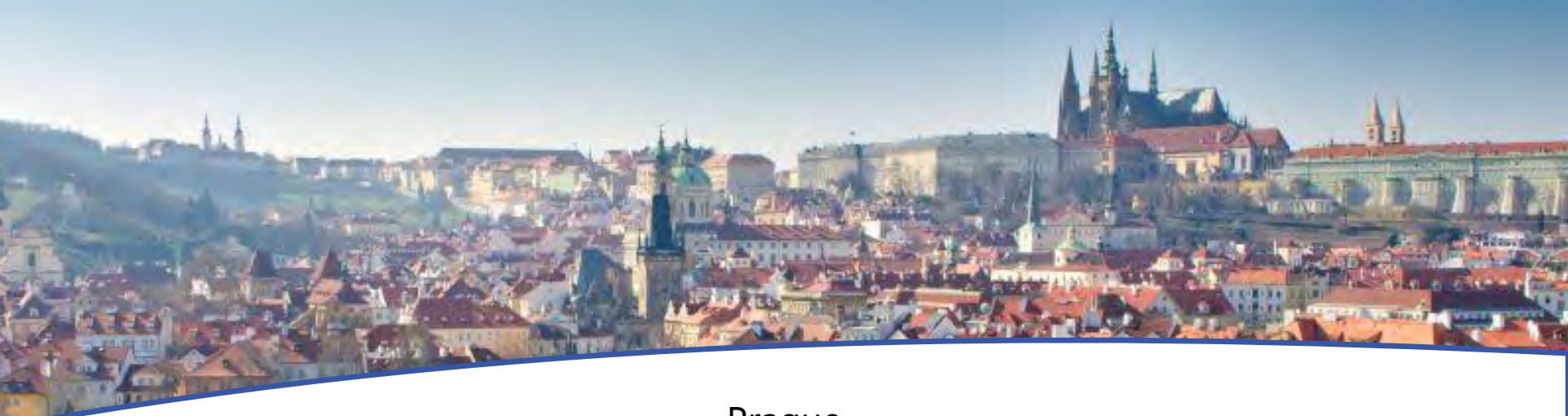

Prague

Prague, the City of a Hundred Spires, is one of the most beautiful cities in the world. Prague is home to a number of famous cultural attractions, many of which survived the violence and destruction of 20th-century Europe. The main attractions include the Prague Castle, the Charles Bridge, Old Town Square with the Prague astronomical clock, the Jewish Quarter, Petrin Hill and Vysehrad. Since 1992, the extensive historic center of Prague has been included in the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites. Prague is famous for its cultural life. Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart lived here, and his Prague Symphony and Don Giovanni were first performed in the city. In addition, the lyric music of the great Czech composers Bedrich Smetana, Antonin Dvorak, and Leos Janacek is commemorated each year in a spring music festival.

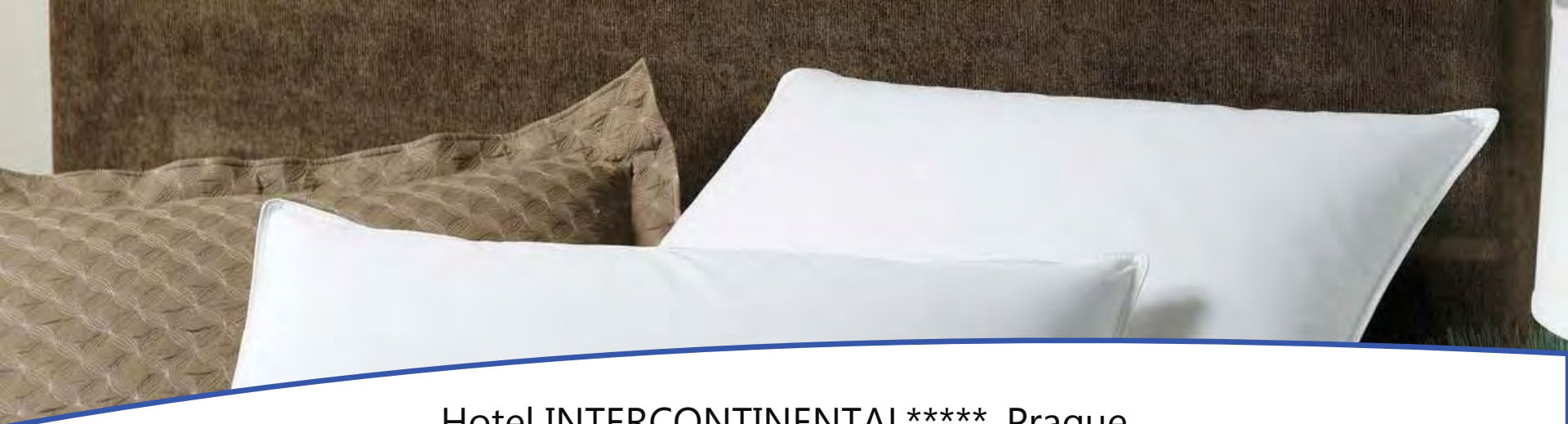

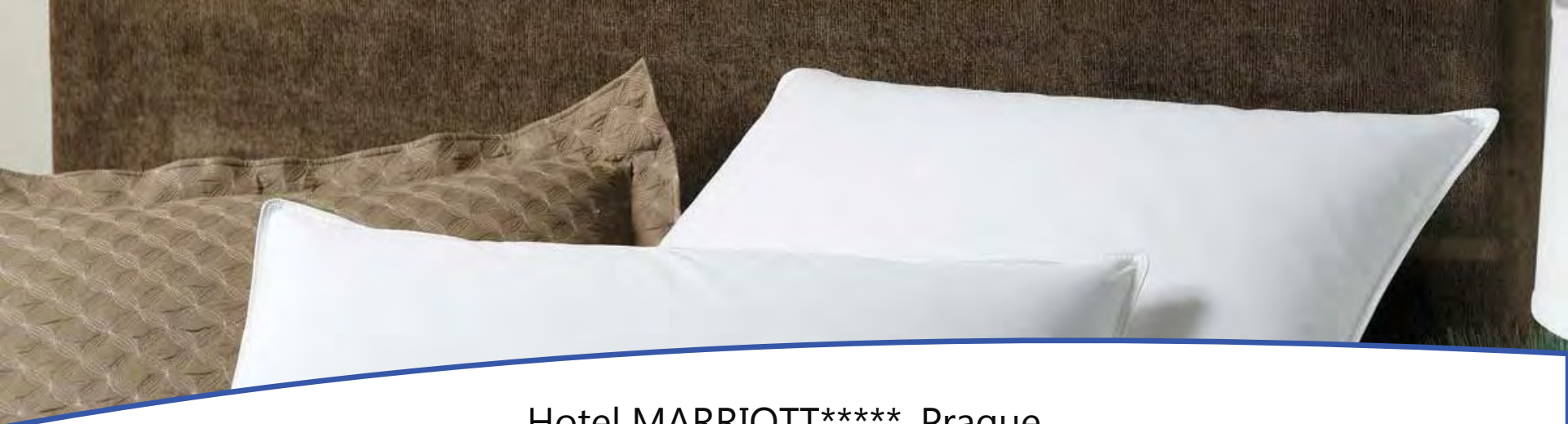




Hotel INTERCONTINENTAL*****, Prague

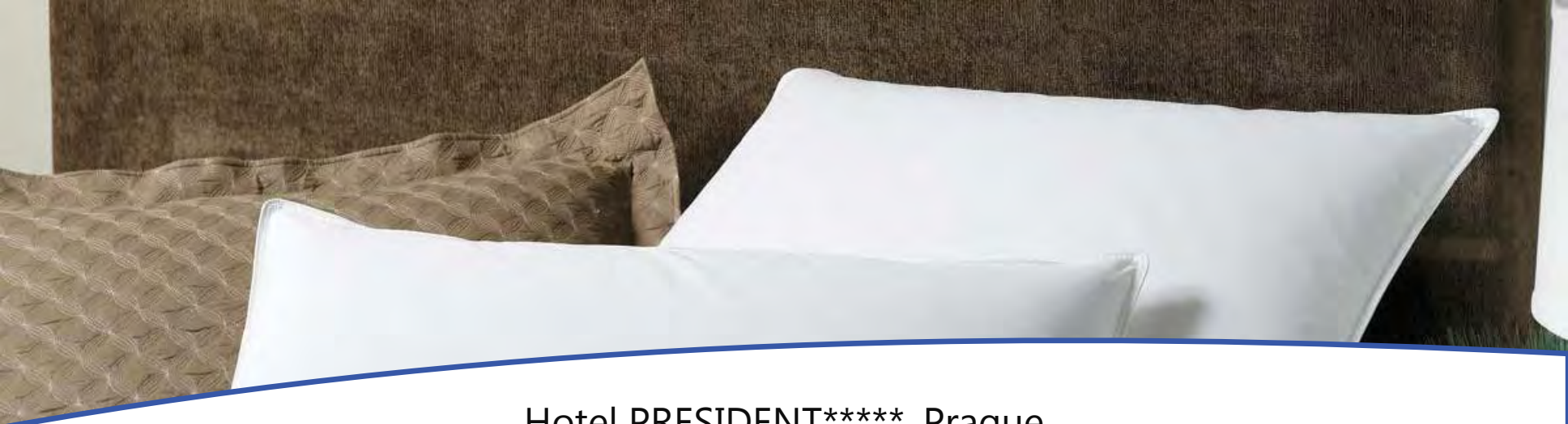




Hotel MARRIOTT*****, Prague

Just a minute's walk from the center of the Old Town, the hotel is also close to some of the best shops and restaurants in the city. The Hotel President offers 130 spacious originally designed rooms and 6 various meeting rooms with capacity up to 200 guests.





Old Town Square

Old Town Square is a historic square in the Old Town quarter of Prague. Featuring various architectural styles, including the gothic Tyn Church, and baroque St. Nicolas Church, the square is an oasis for travelers made weary by Prague's narrow streets. Among the many churches, tourists can find the Astronomical Clock, while the tower of the Old Town Hall offers a panoramic view of Old Town in its entirety. The square's center is home to a statue depicting religious reformer Jan Hus, who was burned at the stake in Constance for his uncompromising beliefs.





The Jewish Quarter

The Jewish Museum was founded in 1906. The goal was to preserve artifacts from the Prague synagogues demolished during the urban renewal of the old Jewish Quarter in the beginning of the 20th Century. In 1942, the Nazis established the Central Jewish Museum, with the ironic, ludicrous goal of commemorating the heritage of a people which they unsuccessfully tried to wipe off the face of the earth. Artifacts were shipped to the museum from all the Jewish communities and synagogues of Bohemia and Moravia.





Dinner @ Michal

The restaurant Michal is situated in one of the oldest parts of the historic Prague on the right bank of the Vltava river, only a few steps from the stone archways of Charles Bridge. The restaurant is housed in a fully air-conditioned ground floor which underwent a complete reconstruction in 2012 and consists of three parts, with a total of 170 seats. In the evening, there are live folk shows performed by The Dulcimer Band and our dancers. Our menu features traditional Czech meals, as well as international cuisine.

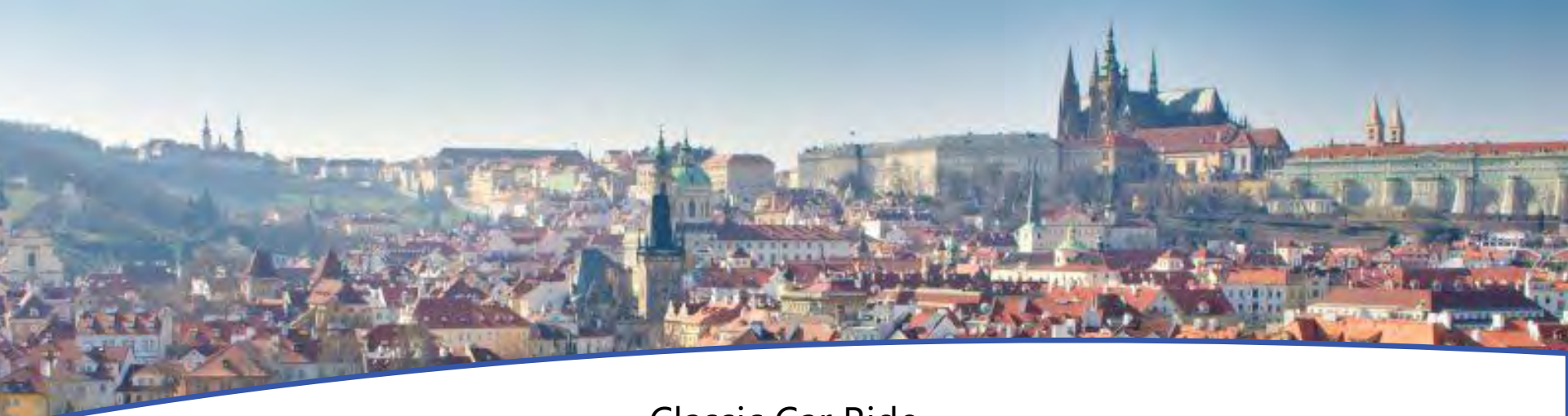

Strahov Monastery

The elegant spires of the basilica, the wonderful period library, the priceless gallery paintings, the film set for Hollywood blockbusters: this is Prague's Strahov Monastery, one of the oldest Premonstratensian monasteries still in existence. This complex successfully marries exquisite architecture with period treasures of immeasurable value. Come experience this great monastery, which is still a vibrant place of meditation, learning, and tranquility.





Prague Castle & St. Vitus Cathedral

Prague Castle is a national cultural monument and the symbol of more than a millennium of the development of the Czech state. It is a monumental complex of ecclesiastical, fortification, residential and office buildings, representing all architectural styles and periods, and surrounds three castle courtyards covering 45 hectares. Originally, it was the residence of the princes and kings of Bohemia, but since 1918 it has been the seat of the president of Czechoslovakia/Czech Republic. St. Vitus Cathedral is the spiritual symbol of the Czech nation, and the largest and most important house of worship in Prague.





Charles Bridge

Charles Bridge is a famous historic bridge that crosses the Vltava River in Prague. Its construction started in 1357 under the auspices of King Charles IV, and was completed at the beginning of the 15th century. Until 1841, it was the only means of crossing the river. This "solid-land" connection made Prague important as a trade route between Eastern and Western Europe. The bridge is protected by three bridge towers. It is decorated by a continuous alley of 30 statues and statuaries, most of them in baroque style. They were originally erected around 1700, but all of them have since been replaced by replicas.





Lunch @ Marina

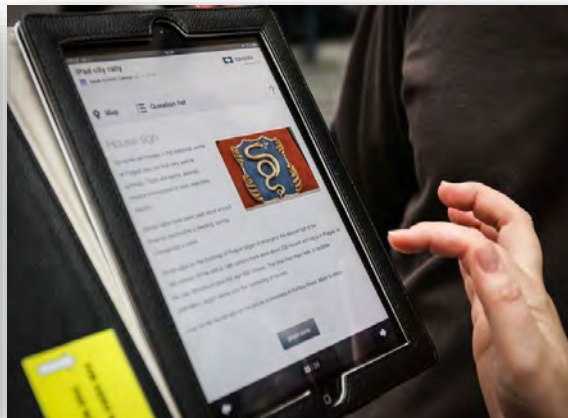

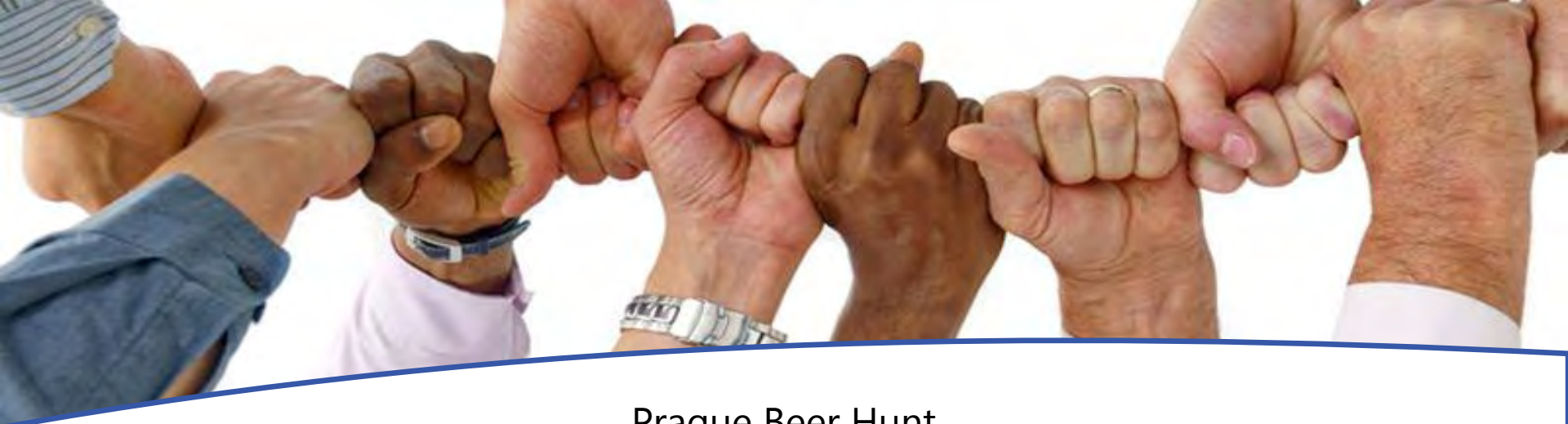




iPad Scavenger Hunt

Český Krumlov

When you arrive in Český Krumlov, you will be captivated at first glance by the monumental panorama of the breathtaking chateau, rising above the picturesque Renaissance architecture of the adjacent town. Thanks to its inimitable medieval character, taking a walk through the historical center will leave no doubt as to why Český Krumlov is one of the geographical gems included on the UNESCO list.





Lunch @ Depo Pub

The original Depo Pub in Cesky Krumlov was opened in April 2014. The unique surroundings offer a picturesque view of the renovated château park along the banks of the Polecnice Stream. At the Depo Pub, you will find attentive service with superb tank beer and traditional Czech cuisine. The pub has a seating capacity of 150, and a further 120 seats are available outside on the summer terrace.





Historic Tram Ride

We offer you an enjoyable ride aboard a beautiful historic tram through Prague's picturesque center. The ride usually takes around 20 minutes (depending on the specific route), and you will be able to see all the main highlights of the city. During your tram ride, the atmosphere is highlighted by an accordion player, and a glass of sparkling wine or beer is provided as a welcome drink. The capacity of one tram is 60 passengers in two separate cars. All aboard!





Dinner @ Mlynec

Mlynec Restaurant is in a stunning location by the river in the very center of Prague, next to and overlooking Charles Bridge. It offers a wonderfully balanced international menu, using fresh local and seasonal ingredients whenever possible. The atmosphere at Mlynec is elegant and sophisticated with refined service, but the staff will ensure that you feel welcome and comfortable.

Municipal House

The Municipal House is a major civic landmark and concert hall in Prague, and an important building in the architectural and political history of the Czech Republic. The Royal Court Palace used to be located on the site of the Municipal House, in which the King of Bohemia lived between 1383 and 1485. The interior features murals by Alphonse Mucha. The main space within the Municipal House is the concert space, the Smetana Hall, named in honor of Bedrich Smetana. On October 28, 1918, the Smetana Hall was the location of the Czechoslovak Declaration of Independence.





Lunch @ Pilsner Restaurant in the Municipal House

The beautiful Art Nouveau Plzenska Restaurant is situated in the basement of the Municipal House. If you prefer a more genuine Czech tradition, you should not refuse an invitation to partake in the traditional Czech specialties and excellent Pilsner beer! In the evening you can listen to typical Czech music, provided live by an accordionist, or by Duo Svejek. The capacity of the restaurant is 500 persons.
